On the TV side, Simon is known as a long time member of the THEM THERE theatrical production collective, starring in and writing HORRIBLE HISTORIES and the long-running BBC comedy GHOSTS. Simon's first children's book–THE WIZARD IN MY SHED has also been picked up by a major studio, and his follow up THE WARRIOR IN MY WARDROBE has just hit the shelves.
