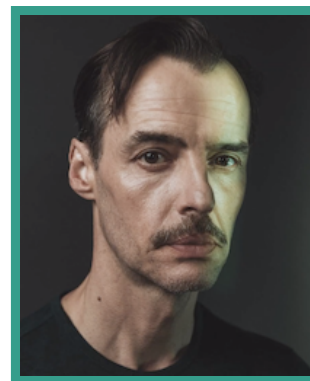


Paul Hilton
