Luke Alkin joined Big Talk from Channel 4 where he was acting Head of Drama. During his time there, Peter Flannery's-The Devil's Whore-and Tony Grisoni's masterful adaptation of-Red Riding-went into production. Prior to this, he worked at BBC Films as a development executive where his credits included multi-award-winning-The Gathering Storm-starring Albert Finney,-Bulletboy-and Dominic Savage's-Out Of Control-which won the RTS award. Luke optioned Jon Ronson's book-The Men Who Stare At Goats-which was adapted by Peter Straughn and starred George Clooney. Luke produced-Dirty War-for HBO Films and the BBC,-Learners-starring David Tennant and Jessica Hynes for BBC 1 and Frank Cottrell Boyce's-Grow Your Own-for BBC Films, the UK Film Council and Pathé. At Big Talk, Luke was series producer of two series of-Threesome-for Comedy Central. He produced Mike Bartlett's acclaimed drama-The Town-starring Andrew Scott and Martin Clunes for ITV. He was the executive producer of-Youngers-by Levi David Addai for E4 and-Ambassadors-by James Wood and Rupert Walters for BBC 2. Most recently he executive produced-Our Zoo, Big Talk first major drama for BBC 1 which was created and written by Matt Charman and starred Lee Ingleby, Liz White, Peter Wight and Anne Reid.
